Arturo Sandoval, Trumpet Virtuoso, Headlines Compton Heights Concert Band Benefit "Pizzazz & Jazz Pops Concert" Set For Saturday, May 1 at Plaza Frontenac

The amazing trumpet virtuoso, Arturo Sandoval, makes an exciting return visit to the Compton Heights Concert Band as headliner for the Band's Benefit "Pizzazz & Jazz Pops Concert" set for Plaza Frontenac, Saturday, May 1, 1993 at 8:00 p.m.

The Benefit provides a rare opportunity for St. Louis jazz fans and trumpet aficionados to hear one of the greatest trumpet artists the world has ever known. Called "Jazz Trumpeter of the Decade" by revered L. A. Times jazz critic, Leonard Feather, Sandoval has been on a meteoric rise since his defection from Cuba just two years ago. Already, he has garnered four



Grammy Award nominations and has pushed the top off the charts with his album, *I Remember Clifford*, a tribute to the late Clifford Brown.

Sandoval, in a classical trumpet mode, solos in *The Carnival of Venice, Trumpeter's Lullaby,* by Leroy Anderson, and *La Macarena de le Virgen* (The Bullfighter's Song) by Rafael Mendez backed by the 70-piece Compton Heights Concert Band from 8:00 - 9:30 pm. In the nightcap of a Double Bill, Sandoval will appear as guest soloist with the world-renowned Lincoln High School Jazz Band, swinging into action at 10:00 pm in big band and jazz favorites. Dancing to the jazz band will be another highlight of the evening's fun.

The Pops Concert takes place on the first level of Plaza Frontenac, with tables and chairs filling the main hallway. A silent auction, starting when the doors open at 7:00 pm, will feature donated items from merchants at the Plaza, and other sponsors. Convenient cash bars serving beer, wine and snacks will be afforded all concert-goers throughout the evening.

Emceeing the Benefit will be Elaine Viets, author. Viets is also honorary co-chair of the Pops Concert's select committee, along with Debbye Turner, Miss America 1990, sportscaster Jack Buck, and Stan "The Man" Musial.

Band History

Whether it's an antique clock or a stately old house, perhaps you have felt the sense of satisfaction that comes from restoring and breathing life into some relic of a bygone day. That same preservationist philosophy is the driving force behind the Compton Heights Concert Band of St. Louis and our efforts to promote and perform the fine concert band literature of yesteryear.

The Band was organized in 1976 by Band President Harry Swanger, and numbered only 18 members at its first performance. Today the Band has grown to include some 70 volunteer, student, and professional musicians from the metropolitan St. Louis area.

Musical Mondays, the Band's eight-week summer series of old-fashioned band concerts, held annually since 1980, is held in the Henry Shaw Memorial Bandstand in Tower Grove Park, recently designated a national historic landmark. The Band's other popular series, Sunday Serenades, held at Francis Park in south St. Louis, began in 1986. They are now two of the city's favorite musical traditions, attracting over 50,000 listeners annually.

In keeping with the Sousa-style program, each concert features a different soloist. Over the years the Band has had the honor of performing with such well-known greats as William Warfield, James Christensen (director of music at Disney World in Florida), Dr. Leonard Smith, Debbye Turner (Miss America 1990), and Arturo Sandoval. In 1988 the Band hosted the national convention of the Association of Concert Bands, an occasion marked by Missouri Senate and House Resolutions. Most recently the Band has been acclaimed by audiences throughout the State of Missouri under the Missouri Arts Council Touring Program and other sponsors.

Dr. Gregory Fox was appointed Conductor of the Band in September 1992. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from the State University of New York at Fredonia, and a Master's degree and Doctorate in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana. He has been involved with bands ever since his elementary school days in Jamestown, NY. Dr. Fox has studied conducting with such notables as Harry Begian and Carl Topilow. He is also an accomplished tubist, having performed with bands and orchestras in New York, Pennsylvania, Illinois and Missouri. Dr. Fox is a founding member of the Arch Brass, and has organized and conducted the annual Merry Tuba Christmas concert at the St. Louis Galleria since 1989.

To help finance its many expenses, the Compton Heights Concert Band depends upon individual and corporate donations, concert sponsors' fees, a weekly Bingo, sales of souvenirs, and Bandwagon memberships Support also comes from the Missouri Arts Council, The Regional Arts Commission, The Arts and Education Council, The Monsanto Fund, and the Clifford Willard Gaylord Foundation.

in Double Bill with The Lincoln High School Jazz Band



The East St. Louis Lincoln High School Jazz Band is one of the most sought-after groups in the Midwest region. This seasoned band competed in *Downbeat Magazine's* National Jazz Competition in 1987, and again in 1989, and was awarded top honors as the number one Jazz Band in the nation. The Jazz Band toured Europe in 1980 and 1989, and received rave reviews for outstanding performances at the Montreux and North Sea Jazz Festivals. In 1991 the Lincoln High Jazz Band made its debut at the Chicago Jazz Festival.

To the group's credit are performances with leading jazz artists such as Clark Terry, Wynton Marsalis, Hamiett Bluett, Bob Mintzer, Bunky Green, and Oliver Lakes. In addition, the ensemble has performed for numerous dignitaries, institutes, conferences and organizations.


The Lincoln High Jazz Band's recording, entitled "Blues and Beyond," has sold over 3,000 copies. The band's first live, self-entitled recording was released in 1992.
