

American Premiere To Highlight Summer Season

he German ensemble, Die Deutschen Naturhornsolisten, is set to perform with the Compton Heights Concert Band on July 30 and 31. The trio is unique in that they play "natural" horns, the valveless predecessor of the modern French horn.

The horn ensemble has committed themselves to faithful musical interpretation on authentic instruments, in devotion to the their lovely tone quality. They perform a repertoire that spans some 300 years, including numerous pieces by such well-known composers as Mozart, Haydn, and Gioacchino Rossini.

It is a piece by Rossini, written in 1828 for natural horns and concert band, that will be performed for the first time in the United States on Week 7 of the band's exciting concert season. Titled *Le Rendezvous de chasse* and composed in 1828, the work evokes the sounds and atmosphere of the hunt.

About the Band

The Compton Heights Concert Band was organized in 1976 by Band President and Executive Director Harry Swanger. The band currently numbers some 60 musicians from the St. Louis metro area.


Musical Mondays, the band's eight-week summer series of oldfashioned band concerts, has been presented annually since 1980 at the Henry Shaw Bandstand at Tower Grove Park. The band's other popular series, Sunday Serenades, has been held at St. Louis's Francis Park since 1986. They are two of the city's favorite musical traditions, attracting some 50,000 listeners annually.

In keeping with the tradition Sousa-style program, each concert features a different instrumental or vocal soloist. Over the years the band has had the honor of performing with some of the nation's most notable musical talents, including William Warfield, James Christensen, Dr. Leonard Smith, and Arturo Sandoval.

The band is directed by Dr. Gregory C. Fox (right). Dr. Fox obtained his doctorate from the University of Illinois, where he studied conducting with Harry Begian and Paul Vermel. He has taught music at every level from elementary school to the university level.

It's all topped off with a moving rendition of the Battle Hymn of the Republic, and a Star Spangled Banner Finale made famous by recording artist Sandi Patti.
