## COMPTON HEIGHTS CONCERT BAND HISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

- 1975 Harry Swanger scoffs at "canned" music at Compton Heights Neighborhood Easter Parade
- 1976 Band forms in Harry's Compton Heights living room
- 1977 Conductor Kaid Friedel leads first concert in Tower Grove Park
- 1980 First series "Tune-Full Tuesdays" (now "Musical Mondays") begins in Tower Grove Park
- 1983 Band plays to one million at VP Fair Main Stage; Band bus ends in River!
- 1986 "Sunday Serenades" series begins in Francis Park
- 1987 Malcolm McDuffee becomes band conductor
- 1988 Band hosts Association of Concert Bands (ACB) national community band convention
- 1989 Band's first tour to ACB convention in Omaha, NE and St. Joseph, MO
- 1992 Band's first indoor series, "Band on Grand" at Grand Center. First Missouri Arts Council Tour concert in Hermann, MO; Gregory Fox become band conductor; band performs at rededication of Bandstand in Tower Grove Park
- 1996 Compton Heights Concert Band's Spectacular 20th Anniversary Season!
