

Band History

The Compton Heights Concert Band of St. Louis was organized in 1976. Initially, the Band performed at Compton Heights Neighborhood events such as the Easter, July 4th and Christmas celebrations. The Band's membership numbered 18 at its first performance. Growing rapidly in size and experience, the Band made its first major public appearance in August, 1977, in the Tower Grove Park Concert Series held in the Henry Shaw Memorial Bandstand. Presently, the Band consists of over fifty members who represent some of the leading amateur, student and professional musicians from the St. Louis Metropolitan Area. The Band continues to be St. Louis' only community concert band and includes in its membership lawyers, doctors, teachers, journalists, nurses, retailers, small business owners, printers, government workers, computer specialists and other miscellaneous occupations.

The Band Director, Kaid Friedel, is a Compton Heights resident and member of the St. Louis Symphony horn section. He has directed the Band from its inception. Mr. Friedel brings to the Band a long professional conducting career including the Alton Civic Orchestra, Kansas City American Legion Band and Kansas City Youth Symphony. Steve Robinson, a professional trumpet player and St. Louis Public School music teacher, is the Assistant Band Director. A UMKC graduate, he toured and performed on trumpet with the U.S. Air Force Band in Europe for several years.

Last year the Band presented its sixth "MUSICAL MONDAYS" (originally "TUNE-FULL TUESDAYS") series which over the course of eight concerts attracted more than 20,000 listeners to the Henry Shaw Memorial Bandstand in Tower Grove Park. In 1981 the Band and the "TUNE-FULL TUESDAYS" series were honored by the receipt of a City of St. Louis proclamation issued by Mayor Schoemehl declaring one of the series' nights as "TUNE-FULL TUESDAYS" in St. Louis. This year's "MUSICAL MONDAYS" begins Monday, June 23, 1986, on the Shaw Bandstand, for eight consecutive Mondays, through Monday, August 11, 1986. In addition, this year the Band will present "SUNDAY SERENADES" featuring a four week Carondelet Park Sunday Night Series, Sunday, June 22, 1986 through Sunday, July 13, 1986, and a Laumeier Sculpture Park Concert on Sunday, August 3, 1986.

The Band has also been recognized by the Selmer Band Instrument Company, Elkhart, Indiana, as a model for community concert bands throughout the nation. Many of the Band's organizational techniques, promotional ideas and fundraising approaches were incorporated by Selmer in a nationally distributed publication, designed to guide and spur the development of community concert bands in other cities. Recently, the Christian Science Monitor, International Edition, favorably compared the Band's activities with leading St. Louis groups such as the Opera Theatre of St. Louis.

To finance the many expenses connected with a musical organization the size and scope of the Compton Heights Concert Band the Band depends on individual donations, concert sponsors' fees, corporate donations, a weekly Bingo, sales of Band T-Shirts, hats, buttons and books, subscriptions to the Old House Journal, grants from the Regional Arts Commission, the Missouri Arts Council, the Monsanto Fund, the Pitzman Fund, and BANDWAGON memberships.
