

Immaculate Conception / St. Henry's Architect: Barnett, Haynes & Barnett

A Gothic building in stone, dedicated in 1908 as the newest home of an Irish congregation. It stands on Lafayette Avenue on the city's near south side, less than a block from the bustle of I-44. Three rose windows punctuate the soaring interior; stained glass windows are even found inside the bell tower (which gives the appearance that it was meant to be raised to a greater height when funds allowed.) 
We are buying the historic Immaculate Conception complex which will provide us with a terrific rehearsal and concert facility for performing arts groups, as well as the location of our office headquarters.

Stoneback Brass and Stoneback Sisters bring a unique variety of both instrumental combinations and vocal styles to each concert presentation, including solo trumpet, trumpet trio, trumpet quartet, brass quintet, and a cappella singing. Members of the Stoneback Brass include family members, Ron, Margie, and triplet daughters, Mary, Kristin and Sarah Stoneback.

Since 1992, Stoneback Brass has performed in excess of 1,000 concerts and functions throughout the United States and Europe in churches, schools and communities. As Clinicians for Conn-Selmer Company Inc., the Stonebacks have presented numerous educational and inspirational seminars and assemblies in schools throughout the United States. From the fall of 2001, to the spring of 2003, Stoneback Brass served as Artist in Residence at Southwestern College in Phoenix, AZ. In that capacity, they were charged with over seeing the development of the formation of the colleges newly formed instrumental music program. Stoneback Brass has been featured artist-clinicians at numerous conventions and conferences such as the Texas Bandmaster's Association, International Women's Brass Conference, Texas Music Educator Conference as well as the Iowa Band Masters. In the winter of 2006, Stoneback Brass were featured soloists with the St. Louis Symphony Brass in their Annual Christmas Gala, held at the St. Louis Basilica.

The Stoneback Sisters are identical triplets who at the age of 10 began their academic and professional career as a trio and individual trumpeters. At age 12, Mary, Kristin and Sarah were each individually inducted into the Disney's Young Musicians Symphony Orchestra Hall of Fame. In their academic career of music, each has competed at the top in regional, national, and international contests and competitions. They are graduates of the highly esteemed, Interlochen Academy for the Arts at Interlochen, Michigan and studied four years at Arizona State University with world renown trumpeter, Mr. David Hickman. As a trio, they have performed on stage with world greats such as Doc Severinsen, Allen Vizzutti, St. Louis Symphony, Air Force Band of the West and many others. Stoneback Sisters as a trio have been awarded sole performance rights to the music library of legendary Hollywood trumpeter, Rafael Méndez and perform this music with bands and orchestras. The Méndez Library is located on the campus of Arizona State University in Tempe, Arizona and the Stoneback Sisters consider it an honor to bring this legendary music to life for bands, orchestras and audiences everywhere. In 2003, the Stoneback Sisters were featured performers at the International Trumpet Guild Conference in Ft. Worth, Texas where they reintroduced six of the Méndez trios, and were accompanied by the Texas Christian University Symphonic Band. In the summer of 2006, Stoneback Sisters toured throughout Europe as a feature trumpet trio performing works from the Méndez Library, as well as composers such as, Allen Vizzutti and Benjamin Britten.

With each performance, the Stonebacks present a full range of virtuosic trumpet solo, trios, quartets and brass quintets, as well as, vocal insertions. The traditional trumpet and cornet repertoire along with the family's virtuosic timbre and enjoyable presentation have proved to be a joy to a variety of audience

We are thrilled to have the Stonebacks perform with us at Sunday Serenades & Musical Mondays. This is their first appearance with the Compton Heights Concert Band.



Edward Dolbashian has been Music Director of the Missouri University Philharmonic in Columbia, Missouri, since 1984; Music Director of the Alton Symphony Orchestra, in Alton, Illinois, since 1993; and the Compton Heights Concert Band since September 1998. He is also the conductor of the Clayton Symphony.

Mr. Dolbashian began his musical training as a student at New York's famed High School of the Performing Arts. He earned his degrees in oboe performance at the Hartt College of Music, Hartford, CT.

His conducting career began as director of the Holyoke Symphony Orchestra in Holyoke, MA. He studied conducting at the prestigious Pierre Monteaux School of Orchestra Conducting in Maine, under Charles Bruck;

and at Yale University as student conducting assistant to Otto Werner-Mueller leading to a Master of Musical Arts degree in Orchestral Conducting. Further studies took place at the Tanglewood Institute, with Leonard Bernstein, Seiji Ozawa, Andre Previn, and Gustav Meier, and the Boris Goldovsky Opera Conducting Seminar.

Mr. Dolbashian was a member of the Hartford Symphony for 11 years and was principal oboe of the Hartford Chamber Orchestra, the Goldovsky Opera Company, and the Hudson Valley Philharmonic. He debuted as oboe soloist in Town Hall, NY, NY, 1969.

The driving force behind the Compton Heights Concert Band is a preservationist philosophy determined to promote the American Concert Band, the unique American art form created by Patrick Gilmore in the 1860's and perfected by John Philip Sousa at the turn of the last century, and to play the fine concert band literature of yesteryear. As with jazz, another unique American art form, concert bands and concert band literature are undergoing a resurgence in America. Sousa's concerts were dubbed "the world's greatest pops concerts". In this tradition, a Compton Heights Concert Band concert features programming appealing to all ages and musical tastes; "something for everyone".

From its modest beginning in the Compton Heights neighborhood living room of band organizer, President and Executive Director, **Harry F. Swanger**, in 1976, the Band quickly became a metropolitan St. Louis area tradition, attracting over 50,000 listeners annually to its famed summer series, Sunday Serenades in Francis Park and the tandem series Musical Mondays in Tower Grove Park. Last year marked the 9th Annual highly successful Compton Heights Band Holiday Pops at Powell Hall. Performances in the past have included headliners such as Peter Nero, piano; Doc Severinsen, trumpet; and the perennial summer and Powell Hall crowd favorite, Hugh Smith, tenor. Other featured artists include: BBC Cardiff 2005 Singer of the World, Nicole Cabell; Arturo Sandoval, jazz/classical trumpet wizard; Sigrun Hjalmtysdottir, "Diddú", Soprano, David Morris, International Whistling Champion, Buckwheat Zydeko, Sukay, "Music of the Andes"; Alex Klein, Oboe; James Christensen, Walt Disney World; BNFL Brass Band; Butch Wax & The Hollywoods with Billy Peek; the late Johnnie Johnson; Jerry Robinson & Sax-O-Peel, The Lennon Brothers; the late William Warfield, Baritone; Debbye Turner, marimba; Ricardo Morales, Metropolitan Opera principal clarinet; the late Myron Floren, accordion; Keith Brion, Sousa portrayer; The Legend Singers: Robert Ellison, baritone; and Beverly Stewart-Anderson, soprano.

**Edward Dolbashian**, Music Director & Conductor, is the orchestra and opera conductor at the University of Missouri, Columbia, the Clayton Symphony, and the Alton Symphony Orchestra. He was appointed conductor of the Compton Heights Concert Band in September, 1998. He is a professional oboist and an English Horn player, originally from New York. **Lucy Schroeder**, announcer, is the wife of band vice-president and tubist **Jon Schroeder**, an original member of the Compton Heights Band!

In addition to weekly Band rehearsals, members devote thousands of volunteer hours at bingo at Bandwagon Hall on Friday and Saturday nights throughout the year.
