## THE COMPTON HEIGHTS CONCERT BAND

Whether it's an antique clock or a stately old house, perhaps you have felt the sense of satisfaction that comes from restoring and breathing life into some relic of a bygone day. That same preservationist philosophy is the driving force behind the Compton Heights Concert Band of St. Louis and our efforts to promote and perform the fine concert band literature of yesteryear.

The band was organized in 1976 by Band President, Harry Swanger, who formed the band to provide music for Compton Heights neighborhood events. Now numbering over 60 volunteer, student and professional musicians, the band annually presents 30 concerts in St. Louis and outstate Missouri.

*Musical Mondays*, the band's eight week summer series presented annually since 1980, is held in Tower Grove Park. The band's other popular series, *Sunday Serenades*, held in Francis Park in south St. Louis, began in 1986. These musical traditions attract 50,000 listeners annually.

Featuring a Sousa-style program, each concert includes outstanding soloists. Some of the nation's most talented musicians have appeared, including William Warfield, Robert Ellison, The Nuclear Whales Saxophone Orchestra, Sukay, Buckwheat Zydeco, Ricardo Morales, and Arturo Sandoval. Under the Missouri Arts Council touring program, the band has been acclaimed by audiences in Hermann, Joplin, Farmington, St. Joseph, St. Peters, Jefferson City, and Cape Girardeau, Missouri.

Gregory Fox was appointed Conductor of the band in September 1992. Greg calls the opportunity to present 30 concerts a year "unique" and finds the audiences "the greatest!" Greg holds the Doctor of Education in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana, studying conducting under the noted Harry Begian.

The announcer for our concerts is Lucille Schroeder, wife of band vice-president and tubist Jon Schroeder. In addition to her pleasant voice and professional demeanor, Lucy injects a lively sense of humor and energy into every concert, and helps the audience gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of the music the band is presenting.

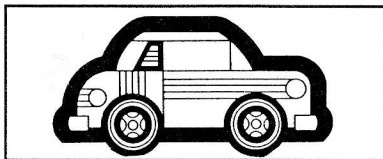

## B a c k s t a g e

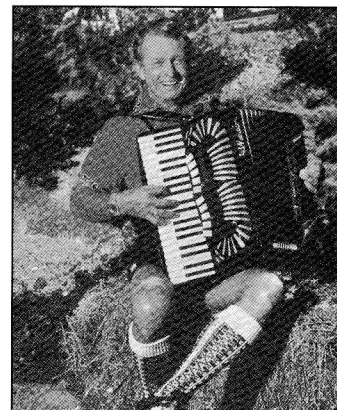
Of all the fine musicians and entertainers on the popular Lawrence Welk Musical Family, the one most in demand for personal appearances is quiet-mannered, fast fingered accordionist... Myron Floren. During the years when the Lawrence Welk Show was being taped and today, Floren travels 150,000 miles each year to 150 communities as accordionist, conductor and entertainer. He is still seen in the Welk Show repeats on 270 PBS stations, including St. Louis' Channel 9 on Saturday nights, and Myron is doing specials for PBS featuring former members of the Welk Show.

When the enthusiastic Welk hired young Floren in 1950, Welk's hotel and ballroom bosses thought he had gone crazy, bringing into the band an accordionist who played better than Welk himself. Lawrence told his manager, "The only people I hire are the ones who play better than I do". Today, the great popularity of Floren, his musicianship, showmanship and dependability bear out Welk's analysis.

A native of Webster, South Dakota, Myron first took up the accordion at the age of 7, beginning, like Welk, with a Sears Roebuck button box that cost \$19.95. With no teachers in that farm country, long hours of practice took the place of formal instruction. By eight years old, he was entertaining at the Bay County Fair in Webster.

Myron worked his way through Augustana College in Sioux Falls, South Dakota by teaching accordion and playing over local radio station KSOO. Having been turned down for active duty in the armed forces, Myron joined USO Camp Shows in 1944 and toured in the European Theatre of Operations...many times playing close enough to the front lines to hear the sounds of battle.

Upon Myron's return from Europe, he joined the Buckeye Four, a country group in St. Louis! Playing over the Mutual Broadcasting Radio Network and locally on KSD-TV. Myron did his first TV appearance in 1947, joining Welk in 1950.



Myron married Berdyne Koerner, one of his former accordion pupils, in 1945, upon his return from overseas. They reside in Rolling Hills, a suburb of Los Angeles, Calif. They are blessed with five daughters, four sons in law and seven grandchildren.

Myron says of his work, "I might be getting older, but when I am on stage and see the folks in the audience and hear the band I'm 18 again...and I have even more fun than the audience".

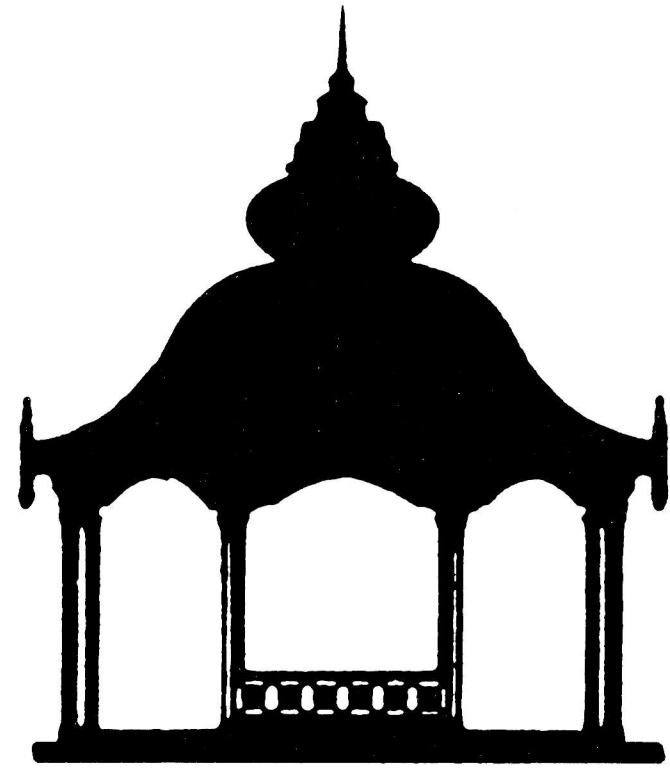
